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Snow & Ice Information

Snow Emergency Notices

Notices will be posted/run on the City's website, Facebook page and TV Channels KCRG and KWWL. The City will declare a two (2) day snow emergency to ensure the city streets are sufficiently cleaned. During the snow emergency cars are to park on the even side of the street on the even calendar day and the odd side of the street on the odd calendar day, unless otherwise stated. On streets where parking is prohibited on one side of the street, the City will allow parking on the prohibited side during a snow emergency only. Streets where parking is prohibited on both sides will remain in effect during a snow emergency.

Failure to remove vehicles from the Emergency Snow Routes while under a Snow Route Parking Emergency may result in a parking ticket being issued or the vehicle may be towed.

Snow or Ice Control Operations

Operations will begin when ~ The Public Works Superintendent, City Administrator or Mayor decide when to begin snow or ice control operations based on the following criteria:

- Icy conditions
- Snow will be removed when:
 - Accumulations of two (2) inches of snow; the Emergency Routes only will be plowed.
 - Accumulations reach three (3) inches or more; the entire city will be plowed.
 - Public Works will clean up and plow appropriate accumulations during normal business hours. Public Works will not work over time unless there is an accumulation of more than two (2) inches of snow.
 - When blowing and drifting of snow seriously affects traffic.
- Anytime snowfall is expected to reach or exceed three (3) inches the city will issue a Snow Emergency. This requires all vehicles to be removed from designated Emergency Snow Routes.

Items Accepted

Unacceptable Items

- Items on trailers, building materials, excessive remodeling materials
- Roofing, shingles, bricks, concrete
- LP tanks, vehicles or vehicle parts
- Chemicals, hazardous materials, wet paint and items of excessive weight or length
- Yard waste, including trees and branches

Safety Reminders

- Stay in a group and communicate where they will be going.
- Remember reflective tape for costumes and trick-or-treat bags.
- Carry a cellphone for quick communication.
- Remain on well-lit streets and always use the sidewalk.
- If no sidewalk is available, walk at the far edge of the roadway facing traffic.
- Never cut across yards or use alleys.
- Only cross the street as a group in established crosswalks. Never cross between parked cars or out of driveways.
- Don't assume the right of way. Motorists may have trouble seeing Trick-or-Treaters. Just because one car stops, doesn't mean others will!



Toter Guidelines

The following items are considered unacceptable for trash toters:

TELEVISIONS • APPLIANCES • WET PAINT • TIRES • YARD WASTE • ELECTRONICS • FLORESCENT LIGHT BULBS • METAL • ROCK/STONE/CONCRETE • BURN BARREL WASTE • CARPET • FURNITURE/FURNITURE REMNANTS • CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS • LUMBER • CARDBOARD

Placing these items in the toter will result in additional charges.

PLEASE NOTE:

- All trash and refuse must be contained in a trash bag before placing in toter.
- The lid must be able to close on the toter.
- The opening of the lid must face the road.
- The toter should be placed a maximum of two feet (2') behind the curb and visible for crews for safe collection.
- Please keep the toter two feet (2') away from mailboxes, poles, vehicles, other obstructions, and from other toters.
- The toter must be placed curbside by your assigned time on scheduled pick-up dates.
- The contents of the toter must weigh less than 40 pounds.
